Firearm safety is YOUR responsibility. DO NOT use this firearm if you DO NOT fully understand the warnings and instructions in this operator's manual. Firearms can be dangerous if not handled properly and safely. Failure to follow the warnings and instructions in this operator's manual, or the improper use of this firearm, may result in serious injury or death, damage to the firearm, or other damage to property. This manual should always accompany your MP5 .22LR firearm if it is sold, given, or loaned to another person. Whether you are an experienced shooter or have never handled a firearm before, you must read this entire manual carefully before handling, loading, or firing your MP5 .22LR firearm. Your safety and the safety of others depends upon you following the instructions and warnings in this manual and constant use of safe firearms practices. If you are unfamiliar with firearms, take a course in the safe handling of firearms conducted by a qualified firearms instructor, your local gun club, or a similar qualified organization.

This manual contains safety warnings and instructions preceded with, **▲WARNING**, **▲CAUTION** or **NOTICE** symbols. These signal words are designed to draw your attention to important safety information.

**▲WARNING** Indicates a hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in death or serious personal injury.

**▲CAUTION** Indicates a hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in moderate or minor personal injury.

**NOTICE** Indicates safety practices not related to personal injury.

---

### These Warnings, Cautions and Notices will apply at all times.

**▲WARNING** Failure to follow the safety information and instructions in this manual could result in death, serious personal injury and/or property damage.

**▲WARNING** Treat all firearms as if they are ALWAYS loaded. If any firearm is handled carelessly or improperly, you could cause a negligent discharge, which could result in death, serious personal injury, and/or property damage.

**▲WARNING** Keep your finger off the trigger and outside of the trigger guard until your sights are aligned on the target and you are ready to fire.

**▲WARNING** Keep your finger off the trigger and outside of the trigger guard while loading or unloading the firearm.

**▲WARNING** Be sure of your target, backstop, and what is beyond.

- ▲WARNING** NEVER give a firearm to or take a firearm from anyone unless the action is open, and the magazine and chamber are free of any ammunition or brass.
- ▲WARNING** NEVER take anyone's word that a firearm is unloaded. ALWAYS check for yourself, with the firearm pointed in a safe direction and your finger off of the trigger and outside the trigger guard.
- ▲WARNING** Be sure that the ammunition you are using is factory loaded, is of the correct caliber for the firearm in which it is to be used, and that it is not damaged in any way.
- ▲WARNING** Before firing, remove the magazine from the firearm, lock the action open, make sure the chamber is CLEAR of any ammunition or brass, and check the barrel of the unloaded firearm for any possible obstructions.
- ▲WARNING** Before firing any firearm that is unfamiliar to you, make sure that you understand exactly how it functions. A lack of familiarity with the firearm can result in serious injury or death, damage to the firearm or other damage to property. Attend a certified training course on any firearm which you intend to use or with which you are not sufficiently familiar.
- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS wear hearing and eye protection when using your firearm.

---

**▲WARNING** The firearm is not **EMPTY** or unloaded until the magazine is removed and the chamber is **CLEAR**. It is possible that a cartridge may be in the chamber when a magazine is being removed from or inserted into your firearm. A cartridge in the chamber will discharge when the trigger is pulled, whether or not a magazine is in your firearm. **NEVER** leave your firearm unattended, even when the magazine is removed. You must **ALWAYS** verify that the chamber is empty before disassembling your firearm for cleaning or any other purpose.

---

**▲WARNING** Firearms should be locked and stored unloaded, secured, and separately from ammunition in a suitable container out of the sight and reach of children and/ or any unauthorized individuals.

---

**▲WARNING** **NEVER** store or transport ammunition in the same container as your firearm.

---

**▲WARNING** **NEVER** rely solely on a mechanical device or your memory to determine whether your firearm is loaded. **ALWAYS** remove the magazine, retract and lock the slide by pulling it fully to the rear and locking it open, and then visually and physically check with your finger to ensure there is not a cartridge in the chamber.

---

1. Store or transport the firearm and its components clean and lubricated.
2. Store and transport the firearm without cartridges in the chamber, magazine, or in the storage container with the magazine removed.
3. Store and transport the firearm with the bolt in the forward (closed) position.
4. Clean and lubricate the firearm and its components at least every twelve (12) months during storage.
5. HK recommends storage in a climate controlled, room temperature environment.
6. Store the firearm and ammunition separately under lock and key.

#### **TROUBLESHOOTING PROBLEMS AND REPAIR**

Common causes of problems that are often overlooked include:

- Fouled or improperly lubricated firearm
- Bad ammunition
- Damaged magazines
- Operator error

If your firearm still fails to function, please contact HK Customer Service at 706-701-5554. Law enforcement users, contact your unit armorer or HK Customer Service.

**a) General principles**

- There are different types of ammunition for different types of firearms. Your firearm has been designed for ammunition of a specific type and a specific caliber. It is important to select the proper ammunition for your firearm.

---

**▲WARNING** Never use ammunition not specifically designated for use in your firearm. Failure to use the correct type or caliber of ammunition may cause the firearm to jam, fail to fire or even generate excessive pressure which can damage or even rupture your firearm, causing personal injury, death or property damage.

---

- You are responsible for selecting ammunition that meets industry standards and is appropriate in type and caliber for this firearm.
- Locate the caliber designation marked on the left side of the upper receiver. This information indicates the ammunition caliber that should be used in this firearm.

**b) Handloaded or reloaded ammunition**

---

**▲WARNING** Do not use reloaded, remanufactured, or handloaded ammunition because it may not meet applicable SAAMI, NATO, or CIP standards and could cause death, serious personal injury, and/or damage to your firearm. Only use high quality, commercially manufactured ammunition in the same caliber as your firearm.

---

**c) Ammunition specifications**

The MP5 .22LR is chambered for .22LR ammunition. .22 LR caliber cartridges have a wide range of loads, from very weak for sport shooting and maximum precision to very powerful for a high projectile velocity. To ensure reliable operation, a semi-automatic firearm must be matched to a certain cartridge load. For this reason, the MP5 .22 LR has been designed to function safely and reliably with high-quality standard and high velocity (HV) ammunition.

- Use only ammunition specifically recommended for your firearm.
- Never mix ammunition.
- Never use a cartridge not specifically designated for use in your firearm.
- Pressure from the wrong type of ammunition may exceed the capability of your firearm and may damage or even rupture your firearm.
- In some cases, a round of ammunition not specified on your firearm may fit into the chamber. Firing ammunition not specified on your firearm may cause it to rupture and cause serious injury or death to you or others.

## AMMUNITION

- Always inspect your ammunition before using it. Never use dirty, corroded or damaged ammunition which can lead to a burst cartridge which may cause damage to the firearm and personal injury or death.

**▲WARNING** .22 LR caliber cartridges have a wide range of loads, from very weak for sport shooting and maximum precision to very powerful for a high projectile velocity. To ensure reliable operation, a semi-automatic firearm must be matched to a certain cartridge load. For this reason the cal. .22 LR MP5 has been designed for high-quality standard ammunition and HV (High Velocity) ammunition, and one can be sure of trouble-free operation only with these types. Please note that these firearms are not designed for the use of cal. .22 extra-long ammunition.

## 1.4

## MANUAL SAFETY

**▲WARNING** Always leave the manual safety engaged (on “SAFE”) until you intend to fire.



**SAFE Position** rotate the safety lever so the indicator is pointing to the word SAFE.



**FIRE Position** rotate the safety lever so the indicator is pointing to the word FIRE.

The safety can be operated from both sides of the firearm.

**▲WARNING** NEVER rely solely on a mechanical device or your memory to determine whether your firearm is loaded. ALWAYS remove the magazine, retract and lock the bolt carrier by pulling it fully to the rear and locking it open, and then visually and physically check with your finger to ensure there is not a cartridge in the chamber.

## 2.1

## INSPECTION

---

**▲WARNING** Before inspection, make sure that the firearm is always pointed in a safe direction, is on “SAFE”, and is unloaded (magazine removed, chamber cleared, and barrel clear of any obstructions).

---

### Functional Inspection

1. Bolt movement: Remove the magazine and retract the bolt by pulling back the charging handle. Release the charging handle to return the bolt fully forward into battery.
2. Bolt catch: Insert the empty magazine, retract the bolt by pulling back the charging handle. The bolt locks back in rearmost position.
3. Decocking: Make sure that the firearm is on “SAFE” and unloaded (magazine removed, chamber cleared, and barrel clear of any obstructions)! Pull charging handle rearward and then release allowing it to freely move forward. Place safety in the “FIRE” position, make sure the muzzle is pointed in a safe direction (a safe direction is one in which no one can possibly be injured in the event of an unintentional discharge). Pull the trigger. The hammer drops to a de-cocked position. Put back on “SAFE”.

## 2.2

## LOADING THE FIREARM

---

**▲WARNING** NEVER forcefully insert a loaded magazine into a firearm. This may cause the firearm bolt to close, chambering a cartridge and making the firearm ready to fire. When inserting a magazine, always be sure the firearm is pointed in a safe direction (a safe direction is one in which no one can possibly be injured in the event of an unintentional discharge) with your fingers off the trigger and outside the trigger guard. Failure to do so could cause you to unintentionally fire the firearm, resulting in serious injury, death, or other damage to property.

---

**NOTICE** Do not attempt to load more than the prescribed number of cartridges into the magazine. Do not alter the shape of the magazine housing, follower or spring. To do so may cause stoppages or the magazine may not seat properly in the firearm.

---

## 2.2

## LOADING THE FIREARM



Press the magazine release and remove the empty magazine



Use the side-mounted button to pull the follower down. Insert the cartridge under the magazine lips, pushing down the follower. Do not use excessive force.



Insert the loaded magazine until the magazine catch locks it in position. After inserting a magazine, always test to make sure it is locked in place by giving it a firm tap on the bottom of the magazine.



## 2.3

### LOADING THE CHAMBER WITH THE FIRST CARTRIDGE

**▲WARNING** Always load a round into the chamber by feeding it from the magazine. Failure to follow this warning can result in serious injury or death to you or others. Never attempt to load the firearm by inserting a round into the open ejection port.



Pick up the firearm with your shooting hand and point the muzzle in a safe direction (a safe direction is one in which no one can possibly be injured in the event of an unintentional discharge). Use your other hand to retract and release the bolt with the help of the charging handle. Never put your hand in front of the muzzle. As the bolt travels forward, it feeds the first round into the chamber. The hammer is now cocked. Leave the safety in the safe position until you are ready to fire.



**▲WARNING** MP5 .22 LR is designed so that it is able to fire when the magazine is removed. Therefore, if the magazine is removed from the firearm and there is a loaded round in the chamber, it will fire if the trigger is pulled. After inserting a magazine, always test to make sure it is locked in place by giving it a firm tap on the bottom of the magazine.

**▲WARNING** Your firearm is now ready to fire. Keep your finger off the trigger and out of the trigger guard until you are ready to fire. Close the ejection port cover if the firearm is not to be immediately fired.

- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS be sure of your target and what is behind it! A bullet can travel for miles. It can easily penetrate wood, plasterboard walls, or even a car door. ALWAYS be sure that your backstop is adequate to stop and contain bullets before firing so that you do not hit anything outside of the shooting range area.
- ▲WARNING** NEVER shoot at a hard surface, such as a rock, or a liquid surface, such as water, because a bullet may ricochet and travel in any direction, striking you or someone else. If in doubt, do not shoot.
- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS be sure that the barrel of your MP5 .22 LR is CLEAR of obstructions before firing. If any obstruction is found, remove it – including any excess lubricants – before firing so that your firearm will function safely and correctly. Any obstruction in the barrel could prevent the firearm from firing properly and result in death or serious personal injury, and/or damage to the firearm.
- ▲WARNING** NEVER use your MP5 .22 LR if it fails to function properly, and never force the action closed on a jammed cartridge because it could cause the cartridge to explode.
- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS wear adequate eye protection when firing the firearm. Eye protection should, at a minimum, provide impact protection with side panels and meet ANSI standard Z87.1. Unprotected eyes can be injured by fragments expelled from the firearm, ejected cartridge cases, ruptured cartridge cases, splash back from targets, target frames, or backstops.
- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS wear adequate commercially manufactured ear protection when firing the firearm. Unprotected exposure to gunshot noise can cause tinnitus and/or permanent hearing loss.
- ▲WARNING** Hot gasses and powder are forcefully expelled from your firearm when it is fired. ALWAYS be sure that your hands and all parts of your body are kept away from the muzzle of your firearm.
- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS ensure that a responsible and competent person is placed in charge to maintain safety, discipline, and control when a group is firing at a range, to reduce the likelihood of a negligent discharge.
- ▲WARNING** ALWAYS transport your MP5 .22 LR unloaded with the bolt carrier locked open in the rearward position while on a range until preparing to fire. Always keep the firearm pointed towards the backstop when loading, firing, and unloading.

**CAUTION** ALWAYS keep yourself and others clear of the ejection port because spent cartridges are hot and are ejected with enough force to cause injury. NEVER touch the bolt carrier assembly or barrel immediately after firing, because they may be hot and could cause burns.

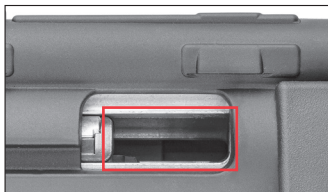
**CAUTION** NEVER place your fingers in the ejection port, other than when the bolt carrier is locked in the fully rearward position and you are checking to ensure that the chamber is empty. Your fingers could be injured by the movement of the bolt carrier assembly.

**CAUTION** NEVER fire your firearm near an animal unless it is trained to accept that noise. An animal's startled reaction could injure it or cause it to injure you or someone else.

Hold the firearm with one hand on the forearm and your other hand on the grip with index finger resting along outside of the trigger guard. Raise firearm and pull buttstock firmly into shoulder. Aim at a safe target. Push the manual safety to the fire position. Squeeze the trigger slowly and maintain the pressure until the round is fired. Your firearm loads another round immediately after firing.



•When you are finished firing, release the trigger, remove your finger from the trigger guard, and set the safety selector to the "SAFE" position.



•If you have fired the last round from the magazine, the bolt will be held in the rear-most position so that the firearm can quickly be reloaded by replacing the magazine, or the chamber can be inspected to ensure it is empty.

---

**▲WARNING** Keep the firearm pointed in a safe direction when decocking. Failure to do this can result in serious injury or death.

---

**▲WARNING** The firearm is not EMPTY or unloaded until the magazine is removed and the chamber is CLEAR. It is possible that a cartridge may be in the chamber when a magazine is being removed from or inserted into your firearm. A cartridge in the chamber will discharge when the trigger is pulled, whether or not a magazine is in your firearm. NEVER leave your firearm unattended, even when the magazine is removed. You must ALWAYS verify that the chamber is empty before disassembling your firearm for cleaning or any other purpose.

---

**▲WARNING** NEVER rely solely on a mechanical device or your memory to determine whether your firearm is loaded. ALWAYS remove the magazine, retract and lock the bolt carrier by pulling it fully to the rear and locking it open, and then visually and physically check with your finger to ensure there is not a cartridge in the chamber.

---

- If you decide not to fire after the hammer has been cocked or if you decide to stop firing, keep the firearm pointed in a safe direction (a safe direction is one in which no one can possibly be injured in the event of an unintentional discharge).
- Remove your finger from within the trigger guard.
- Place the manual safety in the “SAFE” position and remove the magazine.
- Pull the charging handle rearward to eject any remaining cartridge(s).
- Make sure that the firearm is unloaded (magazine removed, chamber cleared, and barrel clear of any obstructions)!
- You must be certain there is no cartridge in the chamber or obstructions in the barrel. Remember that any time you release the bolt while a magazine containing cartridges is in the firearm, you will have reloaded the firearm and it will be capable of firing.
- Place the manual safety in the “FIRE” position.
- With the firearm pointed in a safe direction, squeeze the trigger to decock firearm.
- Place the manual safety in the “SAFE” position.
- The firearm may now be transported safely.

**NOTE:** The gun has an internal bolt catch. To put the bolt into its forward position, retract the charging handle and release it.

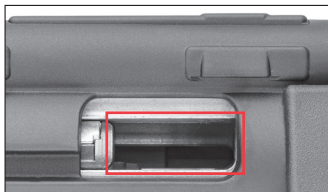
---

**▲WARNING** The firearm is not EMPTY or unloaded until the magazine is removed and the chamber is CLEAR. It is possible that a cartridge may be in the chamber when a magazine is being removed from or inserted into your firearm. A cartridge in the chamber will discharge when the trigger is pulled, whether or not a magazine is in your firearm. NEVER leave your firearm unattended, even when the magazine is removed. You must ALWAYS verify that the chamber is empty before disassembling your firearm for cleaning or any other purpose.

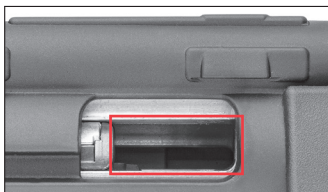
## UNLOADING AND SAFETY CHECK

## FIREARM WITH EMPTY MAGAZINE

**NOTE:** After the last round has been fired, the bolt catch holds the bolt in the open position. Place the manual safety in the “SAFE” position.



### Continue shooting

Hold the pistol grip of the firearm in your shooting hand, with your finger off the trigger and the firearm pointed in a safe direction (a safe direction is one in which no one can possibly be injured in the event of an unintentional discharge). Replace the empty magazine with a loaded magazine. Pull the bolt rearward using the charging handle and release it. The bolt will travel forward and load the chamber with the first round from the magazine.

### Discontinue shooting

Remove the magazine and inspect the chamber to make sure it does not contain any ammunition. Close the bolt and decock the hammer as described in Section 2.5.

---

**▲WARNING** If your firearm gives any indication that it is not performing properly or the operation of your firearm has changed “the way it feels or sounds”, stop firing. Make sure the firearm is pointed in a safe direction, unload the firearm and have it inspected and test fired by an HECKLER & KOCH qualified gunsmith.

---

**▲WARNING** If an unfired cartridge hangs up, jams, or binds while being chambered, do not attempt to force it into the chamber by pushing or striking the bolt carrier assembly to attempt to close it because this could cause the cartridge to burst, which can result in fragments of the cartridge flying out of the ejection port with sufficient force to cause death, serious personal injury, and/or property damage.

---

**▲WARNING** If an unfired cartridge hangs up, jams, or binds while being chambered, do not attempt to force it into the chamber by pushing or striking the bolt carrier assembly to attempt to close it because this could cause the cartridge to burst, which can result in fragments of the cartridge flying out of the ejection port with sufficient force to cause death, serious personal injury, and/or property damage.

---

- If a cartridge fails to fire, wait 30 seconds while keeping the muzzle pointed in a safe direction (a safe direction is one in which no one can possibly be injured in the event of an unintentional discharge).
- Keep your finger off the trigger and out of the trigger guard.
- Place the manual safety in the “SAFE” position and remove the magazine.
- Grasp the bolt with the charging handle and briskly pull it fully rearward to eject the misfired round. Check the barrel chamber and bore visually for any obstructions. Never look down the barrel from the muzzle end.
- You must be certain there are no cartridges in the chamber or obstructions in the barrel. Remember that any time you release the bolt while a magazine containing cartridges is in the firearm, you will have reloaded the firearm and it will be capable of firing.

**NOTE: In case of feeding failures, retract the charging handle to extract the damaged round.**

---

**▲WARNING** Never try to use a misfired cartridge again.

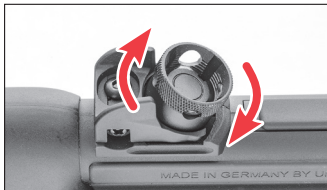
## SETTINGS

**⚠ WARNING** Make sure that the firearm is CLEAR (magazine removed and chamber empty) before changing or adjusting any of the settings.

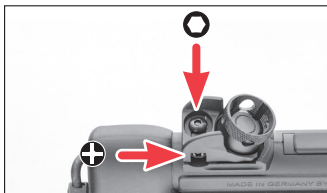
### 3.1

## SETTINGS - SIGHTS

The rotating rear sight drum provides four various diameter apertures. Adjusting the rear sight apertures is done by rotating the rear sight drum.



The elevation is adjusted by turning the sight drum. Turning the drum clockwise lowers point-of-impact and turning drum counter-clockwise raises point-of-impact.



### Windage adjustment (rear sight)

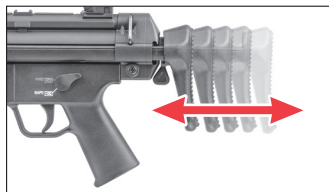
The windage is adjusted by turning the windage screw on the right side of the rear sight. Before adjusting the sight for windage the locking screw on top of the sight must be loosened. After the windage adjustment is made, retighten the locking screw. Turning the windage screw clockwise moves point-of-impact left and turning counter-clockwise moves point-of-impact right.

## SETTINGS - STOCK

### Adjusting the retractable stock (only rifle version)

The length of the buttstock can be adjusted. Pushing the buttstock latch allows the buttstock to be adjusted to various lengths.

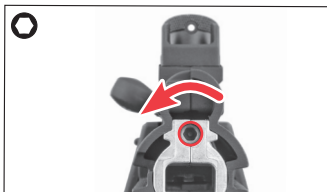

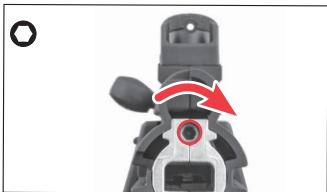
## SETTINGS – BOLT SPEED

### Setting of the bolt speed

The bolt speed can be adjusted for different ammunition requirements. To reach the screw for bolt speed adjustment the firearm has to be disassembled as described in chapter “Field stripping.” Only adjust the bolt speed if problems are encountered when firing a different type of ammunition.



**For high velocity ammunition**, use the correct size hex key to increase the bolt speed by turning the screw clockwise. First, position the adjustment screw so that the screwhead is flush with the surrounding surface. Then, incrementally turn the screw clockwise up to a maximum of 9 complete revolutions to achieve maximum performance. **Do not turn more than nine (9) turns clockwise.**



For standard ammunition, use the correct size hex key to decrease the bolt speed by turning the screw counter clockwise. **The screwhead must never rise above “flush” with the surrounding surface.**

### 4.1

## MOUNTING AN OPTICAL SIGHT

To mount an optical sight you need a low profile mount. Place the low profile mount on the lugs of the upper receiver and secure it by tightening the bolts on the four clamps. Then place the optical sight on the mount and secure in the usual manner.

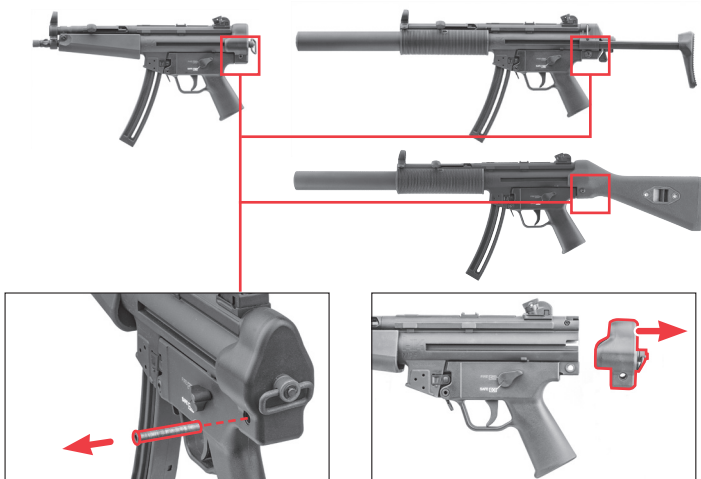

**▲WARNING** Unload all magazines and remove all live ammunition from the area before field stripping your firearm to reduce the chance of a negligent discharge.

**▲WARNING** Never rely solely on a mechanical device or your memory to determine whether your firearm is loaded. Always remove the magazine, retract and lock the bolt carrier assembly by pulling it fully to the rear and locking it open, and then visually and physically check with your finger to ensure there is not a cartridge in the chamber.

**▲WARNING** Never alter or modify your MP5 .22 LR firearm because this could cause it to malfunction and create a dangerous condition.

**▲WARNING** Always wear safety glasses when field stripping your firearm to protect your eyes.



## 5.1

## FIELD STRIPPING



To disassemble the MP5 .22 LR, insert an empty magazine and then pull the bolt back to its rearmost position using the charging handle. Remove the magazine. Push the rear receiver pin out of the fire-arm to the right. Do not use excessive force. Rotate the barrel downwards to separate the upper and lower receivers.

**NOTICE** Further disassembly is not necessary or recommended and will void your warranty.

---

## 5.2

## MAINTENANCE

In order to keep the firearm functional and to extend its service life, the firearm should be cleaned and maintained at regular intervals.

---

**▲WARNING** ALWAYS be sure that the barrel of your firearm is clear of obstructions before firing. If any obstruction is found, remove it – including any excess lubricants – before firing so that your firearm will function safely and correctly. Any obstruction in the barrel could prevent the firearm from firing properly and result in death or serious personal injury, and/or damage to the firearm.

---

**▲WARNING** The firearm is not EMPTY or unloaded until the magazine is removed and the chamber is CLEAR. It is possible that a cartridge may be in the chamber when a magazine is being removed from or inserted into your firearm. A cartridge in the chamber will discharge when the trigger is pulled, whether or not a magazine is in your firearm. NEVER leave your firearm unattended, even when the magazine is removed. You must ALWAYS verify that the chamber is empty before disassembling your firearm for cleaning or any other purpose.

---

**▲WARNING** ALWAYS wear safety glasses when cleaning your firearm to protect your eyes from cleaning solutions. Exercise caution if using compressed air.

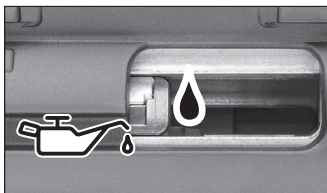
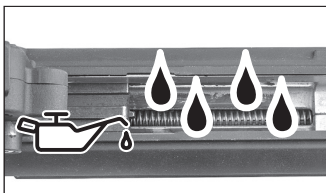

**▲WARNING** ALWAYS ensure that no ammunition is in the area where you clean your firearm. Lubricants can affect the primer and powder in ammunition and cause it to malfunction. This could result in failure to fire, or in a bullet being pushed into the barrel of your firearm and becoming stuck, which could cause the barrel to burst and result in death or serious injury, in addition to damaging the firearm.

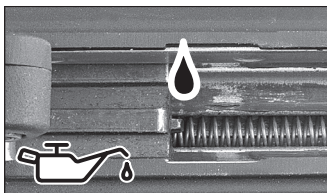

- Field strip the firearm pursuant to the instructions in Chapter 2.5
- Visually inspect to make sure that no ammunition remains anywhere in the firearm.
- Thoroughly clean the bolt assembly area with a brush and cloth (aerosol gun scrubber works great) to remove powder residue and debris.
- Remove fouling from the breech and receiver with a brush and a cloth.
- Clean the barrel with bore solvent utilizing a flexible cleaning rod inserted through the breech end of the barrel (where bullet seats).
- Remove fouling from the lips and follower of the magazine with a brush and a cloth.

**NOTICE** Cleaning the barrel from the muzzle end requires a bore brush that does NOT exceed 1-inch in the length. Using a brush exceeding this length will result in the brush being lodged in the breech area.



- Apply 2 drops of gun oil to the main spring.
- Apply 1 drop of gun oil to the extractor.



- Apply 1 drop of gun oil to each end of firing pin assembly.

**NOTICE** Do not apply more oil to the recoil spring, extractor or firing pin assembly than is mentioned above. Doing so will result in an increased accumulation of powder residue which can lead to misfires and jamming issues

- Reassemble firearm by installing the rear pin. Make sure it is in correct position.
- Wipe down exterior surface of firearm with gun oil.
- Pull the charging handle rearward and then release it to close the bolt assembly.

---

**▲WARNING** Never leave a loaded firearm unattended!

---

Always keep and store your firearm in an unloaded condition with the safety in the “SAFE” position. Keep the firearm and ammunition away from children and unauthorized persons.

Firearms should be stored separately from ammunition. Always store your firearm with the empty chamber indicator (red tab) in the chamber to make sure no cartridge is loaded.

1. Store or transport the firearm and its components clean and lubricated.
2. Store and transport the firearm without cartridges in the chamber, magazine, or in the storage container with the magazine removed.
3. Store and transport the firearm with the bolt in the forward (closed) position.
4. Clean and lubricate the firearm and its components at least every twelve (12) months during storage.
5. HK recommends storage in a climate controlled, room temperature environment.
6. Store the firearm and ammunition separately under lock and key.

**TROUBLESHOOTING PROBLEMS AND REPAIR**

Common causes of problems that are often overlooked include:

- Fouled or improperly lubricated firearm
- Bad ammunition
- Damaged magazines
- Operator error

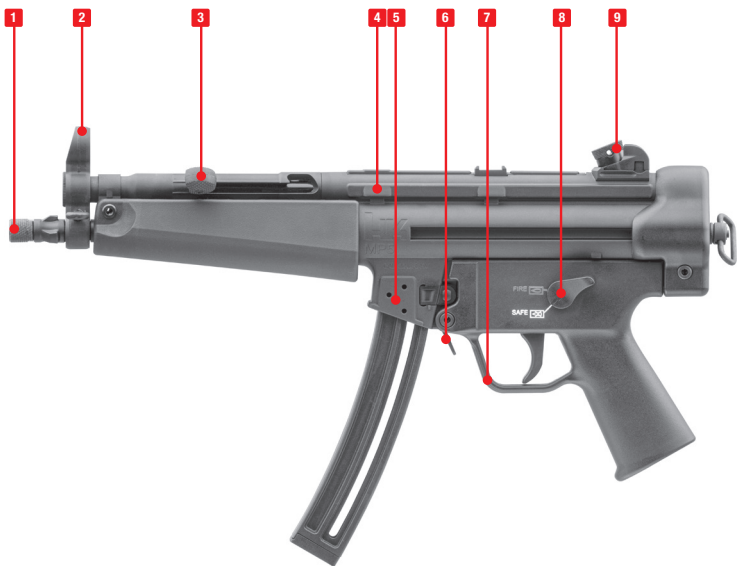

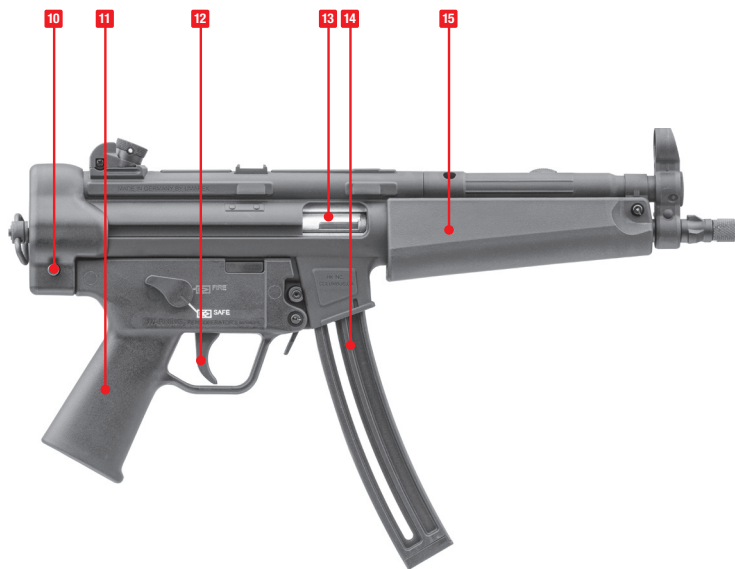

1. The misuse of handguns is a leading contributor to juvenile violence and fatalities.

  - A. a handgun; or
  - B. ammunition that is suitable for use only in a handgun.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person who is a juvenile to knowingly possess –
  - A. a handgun; or
  - B. ammunition that is suitable for use only in a handgun.
3. This subsection does not apply to –
  - A. a temporary transfer of a handgun or ammunition to a juvenile or to the possession or use of a handgun or ammunition by a juvenile if the handgun and ammunition are possessed and used by the juvenile –
    - i. in the course of employment, in the course of ranching or farming related to activities at the residence of the juvenile (or on property used for ranching or farming at which the juvenile, with the permission of the property owner or lessee, is performing activities related to the operation of the farm or ranch), target practice, hunting, or a course of instruction in the safe and lawful use of a handgun;
    - ii. with the prior written consent of the juvenile's parent or guardian who is not prohibited by Federal, State, or local law from possessing a firearm, except –
      - I. during transportation by the juvenile of an unloaded handgun in a locked container directly from the place of transfer to a place at which an activity described in clause (i) is to take place and transportation by the juvenile of that handgun, unloaded and in a locked container, directly from the place at which such an activity took place to the transferor; or
      - II. with respect to ranching or farming activities as described in clause (i), a juvenile may possess and use a handgun or ammunition with the prior written approval of the juvenile's parent or legal guardian and at the direction of an adult who is not prohibited by Federal, State or local law from possessing a firearm;
    - iii. the juvenile has the prior written consent in the juvenile's possession at all times when a handgun is in the possession of the juvenile; and
    - iv. in accordance with State and local law;
  - B. a juvenile who is a member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the National Guard who possesses or is armed with a handgun in the line of duty;
  - C. a transfer by inheritance of title (but not possession) of a handgun or ammunition to a juvenile; or

- D. the possession of a handgun or ammunition by a juvenile taken in defense of the juvenile or other persons against an intruder into the residence of the juvenile or a residence in which the juvenile is an invited guest.
- 4. A handgun or ammunition, the possession of which is transferred to a juvenile in circumstances in which the transferor is not in violation of this subsection shall not be subject to permanent confiscation by the Government if its possession by the juvenile subsequently becomes unlawful because of the conduct of the juvenile, but shall be returned to the lawful owner when such handgun or ammunition is no longer required by the Government for the purposes of investigation or prosecution.
- 5. For purposes of this subsection, the term "juvenile" means a person who is less than 18 years of age.
- 6.
  - A. In a prosecution of a violation of this subsection, the court shall require the presence of a juvenile defendant's parent or legal guardian at all proceedings.
  - B. The court may use the contempt power to enforce subparagraph (A).
  - C. The court may excuse attendance of a parent or legal guardian of a juvenile defendant at a proceeding in a prosecution of a violation of this subsection for good cause shown.

## 18 U.S.C. § 924(a)(6)

- A.
  - i. A juvenile who violates section 922(x) shall be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both, except that a juvenile described in clause (ii) shall be sentenced to probation on appropriate conditions and shall not be incarcerated unless the juvenile fails to comply with a condition of probation.
  - ii. A juvenile is described in this clause if -
    - I. the offense of which the juvenile is charged is possession of a handgun or ammunition in violation of section 922(x)(2); and
    - II. the juvenile has not been convicted in any court of an offense (including an offense under section 922(x) or a similar State law, but not including any other offense consisting of conduct that if engaged in by an adult would not constitute an offense) or adjudicated as a juvenile delinquent for conduct that if engaged in by an adult would constitute an offense.
- B. A person other than a juvenile who knowingly violates section 922(x) -
  - i. shall be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both; and if the person sold, delivered, or otherwise transferred a handgun or ammunition to a juvenile knowing or having reasonable cause to know that the juvenile intended to carry or otherwise possess or discharge or otherwise use the handgun or ammunition in the commission of a crime of violence, shall be fined under this title, imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both.

"IT IS UNLAWFUL TO STORE OR KEEP A FIREARM, RIFLE, SHOTGUN OR MACHINE GUN IN ANY PLACE UNLESS THAT WEAPON IS EQUIPPED WITH A TAMPER-RESISTANT SAFETY DEVICE OR IS STORED OR KEPT IN A SECURELY LOCKED CONTAINER."

**NEW JERSEY:**

"IT IS A CRIMINAL OFFENSE, PUNISHABLE BY A FINE AND IMPRISONMENT, FOR AN ADULT TO LEAVE A LOADED FIREARM WITHIN EASY ACCESS OF A MINOR."

NEW YORK CITY, NY:

"THE USE OF A LOCKING DEVICE OR SAFETY LOCK IS ONLY ONE ASPECT OF RESPONSIBLE WEAPON STORAGE. ALL WEAPONS SHOULD BE STORED UNLOADED AND LOCKED IN A LOCATION THAT IS BOTH SEPARATE FROM THEIR AMMUNITION AND INACCESSIBLE TO CHILDREN AND ANY OTHER UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS. NEW YORK CITY LAW PROHIBITS, WITH CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS, ANY PERSON FROM ACQUIRING MORE THAN ONE FIREARM, OR MORE THAN ONE RIFLE OR SHOTGUN, WITHIN A 90-DAY PERIOD."

**NORTH CAROLINA:**

"IT IS UNLAWFUL TO STORE OR LEAVE A FIREARM THAT CAN BE DISCHARGED IN A MANNER THAT A REASONABLE PERSON SHOULD KNOW IS ACCESSIBLE TO A MINOR."

"Any person who resides in the same premises as a minor, owns or possesses a firearm, and stores or leaves the firearm (i) in a condition that the firearm can be discharged and (ii) in a manner that the person knew or should have known that an unsupervised minor would be able to gain access to the firearm, is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor if a minor gains access to the firearm without the lawful permission of the minor's parents or a person having charge of the minor and the minor:

- (1) Possesses it in violation of G.S. 14-269.2(b);
- (2) Exhibits it in a public place in a careless, angry, or threatening manner;
- (3) Causes personal injury or death with it not in self-defense; or
- (4) Uses it in the commission of a crime."

**TEXAS:**

"IT IS UNLAWFUL TO STORE, TRANSPORT, OR ABANDON AN UNSECURED FIREARM IN A PLACE WHERE CHILDREN ARE LIKELY TO BE AND CAN OBTAIN ACCESS TO THE FIREARM."

**WISCONSIN:**

"IF YOU LEAVE A LOADED FIREARM WITHIN THE REACH OR EASY ACCESS OF A CHILD YOU MAY BE FINED OR IMPRISONED OR BOTH IF THE CHILD IMPROPERLY DISCHARGES, POSSESSES OR EXHIBITS THE FIREARM."

State laws and regulations concerning firearms change constantly. Please check with your State Attorney General's Office or State Police for additional laws and regulations regarding the storage and use of firearms in your state.
